Besides, the states will manage these lands better than national agencies like the U.S. Forest Service, as they can allow more logging, mining and other resource extraction on these lands to help raise revenues to fund needs in our states.
  - People who oppose having state government and (INSERT STATE) taxpayers assume full control of managing these public lands, including paying for all related costs, say it wouldn't be fair to make (INSERT STATE) taxpayers pay the full cost of managing lands that rightly belong to all Americans.
